

Abstract of Deeds

6th June 1773 A Stipul to John Bouchéant & G Hopkins for a certain piece or parcel of ground therein described to hold the same unto the said Bouchéant & Hopkins their heirs and assigns for the use of the society of Christian people called Quakers, inhabiting and dwelling in and near the Town and County of Baltimore to enclose and keep the same for a burying ground to bury or inter those of the same society that may from time to time depart this transitory life and also to erect and build a Meeting House for the same society of people for the public worship of Almighty God, or such other improvements as they the said society may think proper

26th April 1779 Deed of 26th April 1779 from A Stipul to John Bouchéant, Robert Bouchéant, George Matthews and David Brown for Lots N^o 538 539. 540. 541. 542. 543. 544. 545. to hold to them for the whole and sole use, benefit and behoof of the Society of the Christian people called Quakers, inhabiting and dwelling in and near Baltimore Town, to enclose and keep the same for a burying place to bury or inter those of the same society that may from time to time depart this transitory life, as also to erect or build a Meeting house for the same society of people for the public worship of Almighty God, and the transacting their business or such improvements for the convenience of the poor of said society, as they may think proper to erect thereon
