

Deed from John Deacon to John Borthwick & Grand Hopkins Deacon to
 bearing date the 6th June 1773 for Certain property therein described Borthwick
 To Hold for the use of the Society of Christian People called ^{by Hopkins} Quakers
 inhabiting and dwelling in and near the town and County of ^{the} Baltimore
 to enlose and keep the same for a burying place to
 bury or inter those of the same society that may from time to
 time depart this life, and also to erect or build a Meeting House
 for the same society and people for the worship of Almighty God
 and other business concerning the affairs of said society of
 people called Quakers according to the Custom and manner used
 and practised by the said society and people called Quakers
 Eder Flannagan and Eliz^h his wife to John Deacon deed of Flannagan
 bearing date the 9th of March 1786 reciting the former deed from Eliz^h his wife
 Thos Sligh to John Deacon, and that the same was Omitted Deacon
 by accident to be recorded, and Eliz^h Flannagan is the heir ^{deed dated}
 at law of Thos Sligh being the Daughter of Wm Sligh who ^{9th of March} 1786
 was the Son and Heir at law of Thos Sligh to hold the prop-
 erty described in the Original deed to the only proper use
 and behoof of ^{the} Society of Christians known and distinguished
 by the title of friends (and now in the possession of said
 Society their successors and assigns forever
 Deed from William Young and Mary Young To John Wm & Mary
 W Kim and Jos Townsend bearing date the 11th of Jan ^{Young to}
 1793 for two Lots of ground on York Street lately owned ^{by Townsend}

by R. Young Stokes to hold the same for the use of the Society
 of people called Quakers for the purpose of being occupied as a
 Meeting House, and burial ground for the said Society
 Deed from Grand Hopkins and others to Isaac Tyson &
 others conveying the whole of the property described in the before
 mentioned deeds to Hold in trust for the use of the society of
 people called Quakers according to the tenor of an act of the
 U. April General Assembly of Maryland passed at November Session
 1800 One thousand Seven Hundred and ninety three
 Act of ^{society} It is enacted that it shall be lawful for the trustees of said
 Assembly to wit the Monthly Meeting of friends then existing in Bal-
 timore Town to hold the property and lots therein mentioned
 to them their Heirs and assigns forever provided that the
 said property shall be held and enjoyed for a Meeting
 House, Yard, Stabling, Burying ground, School House
 and dwelling House and small garden, to accommodate said
 School Master or person taking care of said property, and
 for no other use, intent, or purpose whatever
