convey the respective property on hand in the said deeds in trust for the use of the Society of Christian People called Quakers inhabiting and dwelling in and near the Town & County of Baltimore; or according to what appears the true meaning for the use of the Society of Christian People called Quakers inhabiting and dwelling in or near Baltimore Town, in the County of Baltimore. -

The act of 1793 confirms the title of the property to "the Society of People called Quakers in Baltimore Town"; and states that it was represented to the Legislature by the monthly meeting of the people called Quakers in Baltimore Town, that they were holders of the property in question purchased by the said Society. -

There doth not appear to me in the original Deed or in the act of 1793, any provision, which entitles the Society of Friends, who frequent and assemble at the meeting House on the East Side of Jones Falls, exclusively.

The Deeds convey the property for the benefit of the Society of the people called Quakers inhabiting & dwelling in the Town of Baltimore generally. The monthly meeting by whom the representation is made to the Legislature appears to be the monthly meeting of the people called Quakers, generally. -

If therefore, the Society of Friends, who frequent and assemble at the meeting House on the East Side of Jones Falls have any exclusive right in the aforesaid property it must arise from some agreement entered into between them and the Society of Quakers inhabiting the City of Baltimore. -

By the act of 1793, the aforesaid property is as aforesaid conveyed, was vested respectively in the respective Trustees to hold
