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"I have inspected the Deeds of which the above writing contains an abstract— and I am clearly of opinion, that the property mentioned in those Deeds is held in Trust for the use of the whole Society of Quakers in and near Baltimore— consequently all such persons as belong or may belong to that Society and reside in or near Baltimore, may use and enjoy that property, for the special purposes declared in the Deeds of Trust— that is, for worship, Burial, use of the School &c— But no sect or section of the Society has a right to insist on the application of that property to any other use, or to its Sale or disposition in any manner whatever—

"I am also, of opinion, that the Act of Assembly passed at last Session on this subject, was a very prudent and proper precaution, to provide for the convenient preservation and transmission of the trust, and that it neither makes nor was intended to make
