Law passed at November Session 1812 for perpetuating
the Trust in certain property belonging to the Society of
Friends lying at the east end of the City of Baltimore, does
not fully embrace the objects of said Society, it being
desirable that the Monthly meetings of Baltimore for
the Eastern & Western Districts should each have an
equal number of Trustees, for the purpose of preserving
& perpetuating the Trust Estate, & securing the Rights
of the said property to the Society of Friends —

We therefore request that a Supplement to the
said Law may pass embracing the objects set forth
in this Memorial —
