this time and the following answers were united with and
directed to be forwarded to the monthly meeting by
Isaiah B. Hopkins who we appoint as representative to the
ensuing monthly meeting of Baltimore.

Answer 1 Our Meetings on first days have generally been
attended by most of our members, those in the
middle of the week, and for discipline often neglected
by some unbecoming behaviour therein guarded against
and the hour of meeting nearly observed;

2 As far as appears most friends maintain love towards
each other becoming our Christian professions
false bearing and detraction appears to be discouraged
no apparent differences amongst us.

3 Friends endeavour by precept and example to educate
their children and those under their care, in plainness
of speech; deportment and apparel, to guard them from
reading pernicious books, and from the corrupt con-
versation of the world, and to encourage their reading
the Holy Scriptures.

4 Our testimony against distilled spiritous liquors is
maintained. Friends avoid frequenting taverns or
other places of diversion, and observe moderate
