27th of the 8th month 1834 One overseer Present,

All the Quaries have been read in this meeting and
the following ~~an~~ ^{are} agreed on to be forwarded to the
Monthly meeting by Isaac B. Hepherts who we appoint as
our representative.

Answer 1st All our meetings for worship and discipline have
been held and attended by most of our members, unbecoming
behaviour has been generally guarded against, and the hour of
meeting is nearly observed.

Answer 2nd Most Friends appear to maintain love toward
each other in a good degree becoming our christian profession,
talebearing and detraction we believe are discouraged. no
apparent differences amongst us.

Answer 3rd Most Friends endeavour by example and precept
to educate their children and those under their care in plainness of
speech deportment and apparel as far as is known and to guard them
against reading pernicious books and from the corrupt conversa-
tion of the world and to encourage their reading the holy scriptures.

Answer 4th Our testimony against distilled spirituous
liquors appears to be maintained agreeably to our discipline
(except that a little is used in time of harvest) Friends
avoid frequenting taverns or other places of diversion
and observe moderation and temperance on most occasions.
