1st Answer - All our Meetings for worship and discipline have been
held. Those on first day mornings are generally duly attended, but
other Meetings are frequently neglected by many - on which account
some care has been extended. Unbecoming behaviour therein mostly
avoided and the hour of Meeting nearly observed.

2^d Answer - We trust that many Friends are concerned to maintain
love towards each other becoming our Christian Profession. Tale
bearing and detraction are mostly discouraged and when differences
arise endeavours are used to end them; but we believe that an
increase of love and more care to discourage talebearing would be
profitable.

3^d Answer - Endeavours are used to deal with offenders nearly as queried
