

4th Our Testimony against distilled Spirituous Liquors appears to be supported, frequenting taverns or attending places of diversion, mostly avoided, moderation and temperance in a good degree observed, —

5th The necessities of the Poor and the circumstances of those requiring aid are when necessary inspected and relief afforded. & the School education of their Children is attended to, —

6th Our testimony appears to be maintained against a hireling Ministry, Raths, Military Services, Gaudetous trade, Prize Goods and Lotteries,

7th We believe friends are mostly careful to live within the bounds of their Circumstances and to avoid involving themselves in business beyond their abilities to manage, mostly just in their dealings, and punctual in complying with their engagements, as far as appears & when any give reasonable grounds for fear in these respects care is extended.

8th Friends are mostly careful to bear a testimony against slavery, those of the African Race under their direction are provided for and some care is taken to instruct them in useful learning.

9th Endeavours are used to deal with offenders in the manner recommended (except those of our members who have joined in the Separation it being apprehended that the right time has not yet come for taking up those cases) Care is taken to advise to those who will not be reclaimed the Spirit of meekness & love before they are disowned
