

The Committee appointed on the Subject of the Library:
 Report: That upon examination it appears, that the greater and most valuable part of the Books were destroyed by the fire which occurred in the Store of the Librarian on the Night of the 22^d of the 12 mo. last. Believing that a collection of Friends Writings and other suitable Works - adapted to the use of the members of our Religious Society, would be beneficial - the Committee are ~~free to propose to the Society~~ - ~~being~~ united in prospect that it would be right to adopt some measures for reestablishing the same as early as practicable. With these Views we are free to propose to the Meeting the appointment of a Committee to take charge of the Books remaining on hand with directions to make such disposition of those which are damaged as they may judge best and that they also be authorized to receive from friends in this City and elsewhere donations either in Books or money to enlarge and increase the usefulness of ~~the library~~ such an establishment
