

- 1st - All our Meetings both for Worship and Discipline have been held. Those on first day mornings are attended by most of our members with the Exception of those who have joined in the Separation. A greater degree of regularity is apparent in the attendance of first day afternoon Meetings and Meetings held in the middle of the week: unbecoming behaviour therein generally avoided and the hour of Meeting nearly observed by most Friends.
- 2^d - Friends appear to be careful to maintain love towards each other becoming our christian Profession - Tale Bearing and detraction are discouraged and when differences arise endeavours are used to end them.
- 3th - A concern is maintained, to endeavour as far as practicable to deal with Offenders in the manner recommended.
