

We have no prospect that further labour with him will be useful: and as it does not appear that he has joined in the Separation, we propose that the Committee be discharged from further ^{care} in his case on that account.

6th The committee in the case of William Yates and George Slough Report, that they have been visited by a part of the Committee, but neither of them manifested any disposition to make satisfaction and we have no prospect that further labour with them will be useful.

7th - The Committee in the case of Lewis Janney Report that he has been visited by two of their number but that he did not appear willing to withdraw from connection with the Religious Society with whom he has recently joined in membership.
