1st Ans. All our Meetings for Worship and Discipline have been held. Those on First-day mornings are generally well attended; those on the Evening and on 6th day are neglected by many. Unbecoming behavior is avoided. The hour of Meeting is not well observed by some Friends.

2nd Ans. Friends maintain love towards each other becoming our Christian profession. Tale bearing and detraction are discouraged. No differences apparent amongst us.

9th Ans. Care is mostly taken to deal with offenders seasonably & impartially, and to exhort to those who will not be reclaimed, the spirit of Meekness shone before judgment is placed upon them -
