

At Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends
for the Eastern and Western Districts held
10th Mo 7th 1875 Two Overseers present

All of the Queries were read in this meet-
ing, and the following answers agreed upon
to be forwarded in our report to the Quarterly
Meeting, to attend which as our Representa-
tives we have appointed John Nicholson,
James Caw, Thomas Wilson and Simon
J. Martinot, who are directed to report
to our next Meeting -

1st Answer. All our Meetings for worship
and discipline have been held - Those on
First day mornings have been attended by
our members generally - Those in the even-
ing, and in the middle of the week are
neglected by many - unbecoming behavior
is avoided, and the hour of meeting is
generally observed

2nd Answer. Friends appear to main-
tain Love towards each other, becoming
our Christian profession; talebearing and
detraction are discouraged; no difference
known amongst us

3rd Answer. Most Friends endeavor, by example
and precept, to bring up their children, and those
under their care, in the nurture and ad-
monition of the Lord, and in the plainness
of speech, deportment and apparel, which
the Gospel requires. They endeavor to guard
them against reading pernicious books, and
from the corrupt conversation of the world
and they encourage them to read the Holy
Scriptures

4th Answer. Most Friends maintain our
testimony to a free Gospel Ministry

5th Answer. Our members, with the excep-
tion of a few, maintain our testimony a-
gainst distilled spiritous liquors - frequent-
ing taverns and places of diversion, are
generally avoided; and moderation and
temperance are generally observed

6th Answer. The necessities of the poor
are inspected, and when required, relief
is afforded

7th Answer. Friends maintain a faith-
ful testimony against oaths, military
service, clandestine trade, prize goods
lotteries and Slavery; those of the
