2nd Answer - We believe Friends maintain love towards each other becoming our Christian profession; talebearing and distraction are discouraged; no differences known amongst us

3rd Answer - We believe that most Friends endeavor by example and precept to bring up their children and those under their care in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, and in that plainness and simplicity of life, which the gospel enjoins - They endeavor to guard them against reading pernicious books and from the corrupt conversation of the world and encourage them to read the Holy Scriptures

4th Answer - We believe our testimony to a free Gospel ministry is generally maintained

5th Answer - We believe with a few exceptions Friends maintain our testimony against the use of all intoxicating li-

quors and avoid drinking houses, and frivolous and demoralizing places of diversion

6th Answer - The necessities of the poor are inspected and when occasion arises, relief is afforded

7th Answer - Friends children are placed at school, and when practicable, under the care of Friends

8th Answer - We believe Friends maintain a faithful testimony against Oaths, military services, clandestine trade, prize goods, lotteries, and Slavery

9th Answer - Friends appear to be careful to live within the bounds of their circumstances, and to avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to ^{manage} control, or engaging in hazardous or speculative trade - We believe they are just in their dealings, and generally punctual in complying with their engagements, and when any give grounds for fear in these respects care is ^{intended} to them

10th Answer - Care is generally taken to deal with offenders seasonably and impartially, and in the spirit of meekness & love
