Fourth annual Report of Committee of Friends Academy for the Scholastic year ending 6th Mo 1879.

The number of pupils entered during the year was Sixty - of which Forty one (41) were boys, and Nineteen were girls - This was Twenty less than the previous year, but it is only fair to state that there was a similar falling off in most private schools, owing to the difficulties of the times & the increased facilities of Public Schools - The following Teachers were employed

Principal Lucius V. Tuttle - Julius S. Tomlinson
 Caroline Lead - Ida Albertson and Pindell
 Prof. Winnes & Prof. Dion - making seven, in all

Five written examinations were held the results of which were quite satisfactory for most of the pupils.

The Preparatory Department under the care of Ida Albertson, numbered thirteen (13) The majority of the other Scholars took the regular course destined to fit pupils to enter College.

This course is however modified to suit the needs of those who do not prepare for College.

By a written agreement entered into 3rd Mo 6th

1879 & with the consent of the Monthly Meeting, the Com^{tee} transferred, under certain conditions, the responsibility and control of the School to Lucius V. Tuttle, who is to make a quarterly written report to the Com^{tee} -
