

Answer 6th The necessities of the poor & the circumstances of those who appear likely to require aid are inspected and relieved, and they have been advised and assisted in such employments as they were capable of.

Answer 7th Friends children have been placed at school and when practicable, in schools under the care of Friends.

Answer 8th Friends bear a testimony against Oaths, Military Services, clandestine Trade Prizes, Goods and Lotteries & Slavery.

Answer 9th We believe Friends are careful to live within the bounds of their circumstances, with one exception, which is under care; they avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to manage, or engaging in business beyond their ability to manage, or in hazardous or speculative trade - they are just in their dealings and punctual in complying with their engagements.

Answer 10th Care is generally taken to deal with offenders seasonably and when done it has been impartially and in the spirit of meekness & love.
