The Trustees report that the cost
 of the Mission Building Federal Hill
 has been \$12,115⁵⁶; the furniture &
 furnaces, fixtures, \$1,014⁸¹; the architect
 matching, insurance incidentals, \$634²¹
 windowing, curb & fence, \$575¹⁵, total
 \$14,575⁵³, with some few items
 not yet included.

With \$5000 donated by Thomas Nelson
 & \$3500 collected from our members,
 which has been paid out, there
 yet remains due upon the Build-
 ing ~~the sum of~~ ^{somewhat over} \$6000.-

The Trustees ask for authority to
 appropriate enough from the funds
 of the N^o M^{tg}, \$9323⁶⁷, to pay off
 the indebtedness, with the view
 of repaying the same, if possible,
 by a collection this or next year,
 also that the interest on the bal-
 ance of the fund be appropriated
 to toward the support of the
 work at the Mission School.

 including a new carpet
 for the main room.

The subscriptions of Men
 Friends amount to \$585.-
