

School and one had been educated at the expense of the Committee.

The unexpected death of Prof Tuttle just before the beginning of the School year 1881-2 broke up the arrangement made with him for carrying on the School.

In this emergency, the upper part of the building was rented to the Johns Hopkins University for one year for \$600 - and Jane Pindell was granted the use of the basement for the free tuition of one of our own members, and whatever surplus she might make - This however proved to be nothing.

The next year the University did not want the building and Jane Pindell was allowed the use of it for \$300 - in order to build up the school, which we hoped a suitable friend could be found to take charge of, the following year.

As however none such appeared, with the necessary mental & financial qualifications the school was continued two years longer in charge of J. Pindell at \$400

per annum, which was all she could afford to pay - The building was let for the present school year (1885-6) to Bryn Mawr School a high grade school for girls at \$600 - in consideration of considerable improvements put by it upon the buildings - and we have arranged with it, for the coming year of 1886-7 - at \$800 -

The Committee recommend that any surplus which may accrue annually after all expenses are paid, be held for the education of the members of the Monthly Meeting and that a Committee be appointed to take the whole subject under care, and report annually to the Monthly Meeting.
