

The Trustees made the following report

Baltimore 4th Mo. 4th 1888

To Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends

Since their report of last year, the Trustees with the assent of the Monthly Meeting have erected five small houses on the rear of the Mission property on Lehigh Street at a cost of \$4669³⁸. This has been met by the sale of \$2000 City Bonds of 1890 and 40 shares of Mechanics Bank Stock and the application of a legacy of \$500. from our dear friend, Matilda Reed, and \$733³⁵ Cash in the Central Savings Bank, accumulations interest from the Schofield Fund, together with a loan of \$800 for three years from George Edward Clark at 5% interest with the option of paying off \$100 semi-annually. The total amount of the Schofield Fund thus invested is \$2833.⁵⁵/₁₀₀ - One of these houses is occupied by the Trustees of the Mission Building and \$8 per month is deducted from his wages for the rent - The four other houses are rented to respectable tenants at \$8 & 9 per month, making the total rental of the five houses \$42 per month or \$504 per year.

Another item of interest during the last year is the occurrence of a fire in the School building 715 N. Eutam Street on the evening of the 13th ult. The damage was estimated at \$389⁹⁹ and the Baltimore Equitable Society is making the needed repairs.

The old meeting house lot on Loudon Cy. which came under our jurisdiction by the decision of the Yearly Meeting of 1886 has been sold, and the net proceeds, about \$238. have been applied towards the liquidation of the debts on the new meeting house in Lincoln -

The property in charge of the Trustees of the Monthly Meeting consists of the following.
1. Lot Corner of Eutam & Monument Streets 137 x 72 ft bought 3rd mo 1864 at a cost of \$15,000. - improved by a brick meeting house 71 x 54 ft. built in 1867 at a cost of \$31,000. of which \$6,276⁶⁹ was paid out of the funds of the Yearly Meeting; also by a brick school house 72 x 29 built in 1875 by Thomas Wilson and presented to the Monthly Meeting and now rented at \$800. per annum for a girls school.
