Dear Sirs—

By deed dated 28 February 1868 herewith enclosed, your body granted two lots of ground on Saratoga St. Corner of Courtland St. to Mr Francis P King and others as trustees for a Normal School for the education of Colored teachers, with provision that the said trustees should be incorporated and receive the title to said property, which was done.

The said deed of 28 Feb/1868 contains a clause that the ground with the buildings thereon shall always be held for the purpose of a Normal School for the education of teachers of for the Colored people of the United States, on account of which a doubt has been suggested as to the right of the Corporation of the School to sell said property.

As there was no intention thus to restrict the alienation of the property we ask on behalf of the School the execution of the enclosed confirmatory deed which will more fully explain matters—We also enclosed for your information

the intermediate title deeds—
