

1888 - The Bryn Mawr School for girls still continues to occupy the school house at a rent of \$800 per annum - We have expended for taxes and water only \$257⁶²; for repairs \$66⁵¹ and for education of the members of the Monthly Meeting \$285; one scholar being aided to go to Westtown another to Guilford College and another to Bryn Mawr College.

The balance now in our hands is \$1283⁰⁴ as will appear by the following statement and is all deposited in the Central Savings Bank at 3 per cent interest.
