

To Baltimore Monthly Meeting
Dear Friends

The Committee in Charge of the Monthly Meeting Library report that they have had several meetings. They have procured a new book Case at a cost of \$26-, in which they have placed the books of a general religious ^{and miscellaneous} character, reserving as far as possible the old book Case for books relating to "Friends" which they have arranged according to subjects.

There are of this about 270 volumes and 230 volumes of a general character.

There are a number of duplicates and some volumes that are encumbrances to the library. The Committee request that they have the privilege of disposing of these; also that they authorized to spend fifty dollars in the purchase of books to improve the facilities of the library as a reference library, and subjects relating to "Friends". The Committee proposes to prepare a Subject Catalogue to the library.
