makes the following report of the different

Branches of Bible School, Home Mission and Tem-
perance Work under its care. -

The Bible School at our Meeting House, Calumet St
shows an increase in average attendance of five (5)
over the corresponding quarter of last year; the
Contributions of the School show some decrease how-
ever - There are forty six (46) Children on the roll,
the average attendance for the last three months of
1890 was fifty nine (59) for the whole School in-
cluding Bible Classes. -

The Boys Meeting at Federal Hill has been held
as usual with about the same attendance as
last year and Evidences of the good results of
the School are continually coming to our notice.

There is still a great need of more teachers -
The Girls Sewing School on 7th days has an aver-

The Federal Hill First Day School has been
held regularly throughout the past year with an
