

was a good sized Friends Meeting in Monroeton Township, Adams Co. Penna. But at the Separation hardly any of the members except the Wilson family remained in unity with us. They had no meeting house, but met for a number of years on First Day Mornings in their own house - There was no Ministry in the Meeting but they received occasional visits from travelling Friends - The most frequent of these were those of our late dear Friend John Scott whose memory is lovingly cherished by the younger generation - Owing to deaths and removals, the little Meeting, always very small, became so depleted that on or near twelve years ago it was discontinued - Friends still occasionally visited the town and held meetings in the Methodist place of worship at Bendersville - In 1854 Samuel C. Miles of Western Yearly Meeting attended our Yearly Meeting with a Minute liberating him to visit our Subordinate Meetings - Early in 12th Month in company with George L. Scott, he held some meetings

at Bendersville, at which considerable interest was awakened and another series of meetings was arranged to be held during the first week of 1855 - These were attended by Samuel C. Miles, and Dr. Richard H. and Mary S. Thomas - They lasted nearly a week and resulted in several conversions and greatly increased interest - After this repeated visits were paid and during the early summer a small Company began to meet on First Day Mornings at the house of Dr. C. W. Mumma for a Bible Class and Meeting - Soon afterwards the membership of these Friends was at their own request transferred from Deer Creek Monthly to which they had previously belonged, to Baltimore Monthly Meeting - The meeting was faithfully held and visited as often as practicable - The attendance and interest gradually increased and several were received into membership - In 1859 efforts were set on foot to raise money for a meeting house; an eligible lot, beautifully situated, overlooking the surrounding country was donated by one of the members and liberal contributions
