

were received from friends and others in the neighborhood as well as from Baltimore and some from other places. - In 6th month 1890 sufficient money having ^{been} collected to insure completion plans were adopted for a meeting house and a contract made for its erection which was duly carried out. - The new meeting house was opened on the 22nd of 11th month 1890 and meetings were held for nine days. - They were largely attended and great interest was manifested. - Many were blessed and four applied for membership. - A first day school was organized. - Meetings have been regularly held with an attendance in good weather of from thirty to fifty and there is much encouragement for the future of the meeting. -

We submit herewith a financial statement showing receipts and disbursements for the house and furniture. - We would further state that the lot ^{contains} forty three (43) perches, lying in the South Eastern part of the borough of Bendersville and is

valued at fully \$100 - the gift of Sarah Mumma. The collar and stone walls for foundation contributed by Dr E. W. Mumma is estimated at \$100 more, making with other contributions from that neighborhood, about \$450 from Bendersville towards the total cost of the meeting house and lot. - The deed was dated 7th month 31st 1890 from Sarah Mumma and husband to Francis T. King, James Carey, Jesse Tyson, James C. Thomas, Joseph P. Elliott, John C. Thomas, Chas. W. Walkey and Hannah J. Wilson in trust for "Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends for the Eastern and Western Districts in unity with the Annual Yearly Meetings of Friends" and it was recorded on 8th month 1st 1890 in the Record of Deeds for Adams County Penna. -

We recommend that Dr Edward W. Mumma be appointed by this meeting as one of the trustees of Bendersville Meeting House. -
