9th Answer - Friends appear to be careful to live within the bounds of their circumstances and to avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to manage - We believe they are just in their dealings and generally punctual in complying with their engagements -

10th Answer - Care is usually taken to deal with offenders reasonably and always impartially and in the spirit of meekness and love

11th Answer - Not any member acknowledged - Margaret H White an Elder deceased 3rd month 24th, 1891 -

12th Answer - A Meeting for worship was established in 1st month 1891 at Penderoille Adams Co Pennsylvania to be held on First Day mornings at 10.30 o'clock -
