The following satisfactory report was received from the Friends Association for Christian work.

The Friends Association for Christian work have the following report to make of the past year's work.

The Girls Sewing School has been more than usually interesting this year. The attendance has been large and teachers very faithful, but more are needed, there being so children in the overflow room waiting to go into classes to be taught.

A Cutting out Committee provided all the garments for the children to work on.

The Mothers Meeting was held once a week during the winter with an attendance of 60 and the women were much interested in the books read and the subjects discussed. Much warm clothing was distributed and at the closing meeting when Elizabeth Cusstock was present many testified to the good received by them through this instrumentality.

The Young Folks Union held its usual monthly meetings but the attendance was not large and

the advisability of their continuance was referred to the young people of Federal Hill with instructions to act as they deemed best.

The Boys School was continued until 4th March 5th with an average attendance of eleven teachers and one hundred and five boys. It was reopened for this season work 10th March 15th and is also in need of teachers.

The Federal Hill First Day School was continued through the summer with an average attendance of ninety-five and for the year of one hundred & one session, including fourteen of pairs and teachers. The mens Adult Bible Class of Joseph P. Elliott was held for seven months and much appreciated by its members. The contribution to Foreign Missions from the school for the year was \$55 ¹⁰⁰/₁₀₀ - An afternoon school with from sixty to eighty of the younger children was held nine months of the year.

The Young Womens Fellowship Union, held four meetings during the year and a social 2nd Mo 4th Mo. The Children's Union under their care held ten meetings including two teas and a Christmas Entertainment for the Free Kindergarten of South Baltimore.
