

The attendance was about fifty three and the interest increased rather than diminished -

No College Meetings were held because of sickness in the family of the Chairman -

The Temperance Committee distributed 9000 pages of tracts and 700 four page papers - Six public addresses were given to audiences ranging from 50 to 400 and much personal work has been done

The Free Kindergarten was conducted from 10th month 15th 1890 to 7th month 1st 1891 at an expense of \$600 - with two teachers and 45 of the poorest children of the neighborhood, between the ages of 3½ and 6 years. - For five days in the week from 9 till 12³⁰ o'clock, with one meal, they are made happy and the lessons which they learned have left their impress not only on the children but the families as well - At Christmas the children gave presents to their parents of articles they had made or purchased with saved pennies - The work for 1891-2 was begun 9th mo 1st -

The Household School was held twice a week during the winter of 1890-1 with an average attendance of 45 - The girls are trained in the

principles of household work and while they are unwilling to go out to work, yet they show in their own homes that the lessons are carefully learned - The expenses were \$163, which was contributed by the Miles White Fund and a few friends - The School is expected to be continued this winter and the Committee would be glad to receive contributions

The Friends Bible School Culand Street & part the past year an Encouraging one as notwithstanding considerable sickness, the attendance was steady with the interest well maintained There are four Bible and four Primary classes, all meeting together at the opening and closing of the School - when the lessons permit they especially endeavor to enforce the truths held by our Society - The subjects of the Ordinances, a free school, morality and Peace were so treated - The average attendance was fifty six and one half -
