

At Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends for the Eastern and Western Districts. Held 7th mo 7th 1892

Richard H. Thomas on behalf of the Representatives to our late Quarterly Meeting reported that they all attended.

To Baltimore Monthly Meeting:-

Friends Association for Christian Work submit the following Condensed Summary of the work of its Committees during the past year.

The Federal Hill First Day School was attended by an average of 9 teachers and 109 scholars being less than usual. Caused mainly by sickness. The Adult Bible Class, taught by Joseph Elliott and attended by 15 men is an important feature. An afternoon session of the younger children is held, but with the adult Bible Class is discontinued during the summer months. Several children professed conversion during a series of meetings that were held.

The Girls Sewing School had an attendance of about 250, but for lack of teachers only about 100 could be taught, the balance being kept in the overflow room.

The Boys Meeting had an average attendance of 11 teachers and 135 boys being 14 more boys and less teachers than the previous year and the work is still in need of teachers. The House hold School was held twice a week from 11th mo 1st to 5th mo 1st with an average attendance of 40 children and a total expense of \$165⁴⁰. Cooking and all kind of household work were well taught. For lack of money the Cooking department could not accomplish as much as desired. Private Enterprise in Boston and Washington resulted in Cooking being taught in the Public Schools and it is hoped that this may be the result here from the efforts of this and other schools.

The Mothers Meeting has been attended by from 45 to 65 women. They have been of much help and many at the close
