 the following recommendations and suggestions and

Monthly Meeting:

First We recommend that the application of Friends at
 Bendersville for the Establishment of a preparative
 Meeting at that place be granted.

Second We suggest the appointment of a Committee
 to consider the propriety of appointing overseers at
 Bendersville

Third The Discipline does not seem to require the
 Establishment of a Preparative Meeting in Baltimore
 in case a preparative meeting is established in
 Bendersville

Fourth We suggest that applications for member-
 ship in Bendersville should be forwarded to the overseers
 in Baltimore by the overseers in Bendersville with their
