 the Care of Friends -

8th Ans - Friends maintain a testimony against
 oaths, Military Services, clandestine trade
 prize goods, lotteries and Slavery -

9th Ans - Friends appear to be Careful to live
 within the bounds of their Circumstances and to
 avoid involving themselves in business beyond
 their ability to manage or engaging in im-
 proper Speculative trade - We believe that
 they are just in their Dealings and punctual
 in complying with their engagements -

10th Ans - Care is usually taken to deal with
 offenders Seasonably and always in the
 Spirit of meekness and love -
