To the Monthly Meetings -

The Trustees refer to the Treasurers report to the Monthly Meeting in 1st month last for a financial statement for 1893 of the different funds under their care - Since then they have purchased as an investment of accrued income from the Wilson School fund \$1000 5% bond of the Consolidated Gas Co. of Baltimore at a cost of \$1022⁰⁰, leaving \$885⁰⁰ in the Savings Bank - The School house which has for some years been rented to the Johns Hopkins University will soon be vacated by it so that the income from that source will soon cease unless rented to others - There being now no need for a Night School at Federal Hill it was discontinued about a year ago and the income from the Schofield fund is slowly accumulating - This fund and the May H. Warder fund are both invested in the houses on James alley which are all rented and the rents are being regularly collected - The furnace at the Meeting house corner of Eutan & Monument Streets and at the Mission building Federal Hill all required
