

under the conditions of the will there are assets sufficient to pay only $\$7 \frac{7607}{10000}$ per cent of the Cash legacies — $\$7 \frac{7607}{10000}$ per cent of $\$3,500$ is $\$3,041.64$ deducting from which the Collateral Inheritance of $\$76 \frac{79}{100}$ leaves $\$2994.85$ which sum the Executors will pay upon the Execution of probate & lease of the $\$2994.85$ the sum of $\$2,567.01$ will be applicable to the Mission work among the Indians and $\$427.84$ to Friends Federated Mission.
