To Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends -

The committee appointed in third month to recommend to the Monthly Meeting a plan for using the money received from the Estate of Rebecca Halvadt for "Mission Work among the Indians" report as follows -

The amount seems inadequate to justify the Meeting in undertaking an independent Mission work of this kind -

The changing condition of the Indians, and their changing relation to the Whites may interfere with the permanency of Friends Mission work among them -

We therefore recommend that the Monthly Meeting appoint a small "Standing Committee on Indian Missions" which shall make a full report annually of its operations and expenditures to the Monthly Meeting to be held in first month. That this committee, unless some other opening for Indian Mission work more satisfactory to them is found, be authorized to arrange annually with "Friends Associated Executive Committee on Indian Affairs" to sustain wholly or in part
