

as the means at their disposal may warrant, one of the Mission Stations under their care, and to be furnished with a copy of the monthly report from that station. That this Committee be authorized to use for the promotion of Mission work among the Indians annually during each calendar year, the entire income of the aforesaid fund and any portion of the principal not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars thereof, until the same shall be exhausted, or until otherwise directed by the Monthly Meeting, but shall not incur any liability beyond this, without the express direction of the Monthly Meeting.

That the Monthly Meeting request its Trustees to co invest the money received from the said Estate, as to render the above amount available for use of the Committee on the first of each year or soon thereafter beginning with 1st mo - 1st 1897 or at such other time as the meeting may deem best.
