The Trustees Fund Report was read by G. Cheston Carey.

The Clerk was asked to write a letter of appreciation to Charles Benton for his attention to collecting rents and looking after the Patapsco Street property owned by the Meeting. The Social Order Committee consented to inspect these houses yearly.

Reference was made to a statement prepared jointly by Washington meetings on full racial equality, and referred to in the Social Order Committee's report at Yearly Meeting in 1949. We ask that the matter be given full consideration, and that Friends come prepared at next Monthly Meeting to say whether we embrace these principles whole heartedly.

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Thomas W. Y. Clark requested that the Public Morals Committee address a letter to Senator O'Connor, urging the passage of the Langer Bill. This Bill outlaws interstate broadcasting of liquor advertisements. This was approved.

Yearly Meeting occurs 3rd month, 29th, so it was decided to adjourn Monthly Meeting to meet 3rd month, 23rd, 1950 at 8 P.M.
