

AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING OF FRIENDS - HOMEWOOD
Held 3rd month 23rd, 1950 by
adjournment from 2nd month 23rd, 1950

There were 28 members present.

The Minutes of the Meeting held 2nd month 23rd, 1950 were amended and approved.

Eleanor Richardson reported on the Margaret T. Carey Memorial Fund:

1. That \$200.00 be given to the Baltimore Urban League, on the occasion of their 25th anniversary, over and above the amount given by the Community Fund.
2. A desk and plaque in her memory be purchased by the House and Grounds Committee for the Library, the cost not to exceed \$150.
3. If there is a balance, it might be applied to the cost of electrifying the clock in the Meeting room.

These suggestion were approved.

We endorse wholeheartedly the statement prepared jointly by the Washington Meetings on full racial equality, and referred to in the Social Order Committee's report at Yearly Meeting in 1949.

The Social Order Committee was asked to prepare a statement for consideration at next Monthly Meeting regarding Coppin Teachers College.

We have an acknowledgment from Lansdowne, Penna. Monthly Meeting that Avidas Dulkerian is now one of their members.

Fishertown should be represented at Yearly Meeting. Harriet Francis and Fred Ickes would require about \$25.00 to attend, covering necessary expenses, bus fares, etc. In the case of Harriet Francis, this was referred to the Evangelistic and Church Extension Committee, and the \$12.50 will be requested from the Miles White Fund.

A very interesting letter was received from Harold Tollefson. He has requested a traveling Minute for the coming months, when he will be in attendance at several Yearly Meetings. We approve that this Minute be granted.

The Hospitality Committee is willing to pay for the cost of a helper to take care of the children at Yearly Meeting time.

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The Wilmington College Choir will be in Baltimore Easter Sunday, April 9. Baltimore Monthly Meeting approved that sleeping facilities at the Meeting House could be used by them Easter Sunday night.

The Meeting then concluded.
