A communication dated 4th month 1st, 1950 was received from Theodate P. Wilson, Purcellville, Virginia, stating plans for the uniting of the two monthly meetings of Goose Creek and Lincoln, with additional suggestions for a possible new grouping of Quarterly meetings, as follows:
