

AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING OF FRIENDS - HOMEWOOD
Held 11th month 30th, 1950

There were 21 members present.

The Minutes of the Meeting held 10th month, 26th, 1950 were read and approved.

Quarterly Meeting was held at Florida Avenue, Washington, D. C. 11th month 18th. All of our representatives were present. A report was received from Edna Goodwin.

Marlin Dawson and James Hunter interviewed Stephen Wistar Simon on his proposed marriage to Irma Wilcox Jones and are satisfied that a Certificate of clearance be granted by Baltimore Monthly Meeting for the marriage, which is to take place at Earlham, Richmond, Indiana 12th month 21st, under the auspices of the Clear Creek Monthly Meeting. Our Clerk will issue the Certificate.

The matter of placing a box in meeting to receive funds for sending delegates to the World Conference of Friends to be held in England in 1952 was again discussed, and the Finance Committee was asked to assume this responsibility.

A communication was received from Alfred Townsend, who desires to change his membership to Roland Park Presbyterian Church, and requests a letter of transfer. The Clerk was directed to issue the usual certificate.

The Friends Fellowship Council and the American Section of the Friends World Committee desire to hold sessions in the new Stony Run Meeting House. Homewood Friends are glad to unite in welcoming these Friends, and we will entertain them here 1st month 19th. We ask the Hospitality Committee to cooperate.

A letter received from the Maryland Civil Liberties Committee thanks us for allowing the use of one of our meeting rooms.

The 1951 United Protestant Appeal of the Council of Churches and Christian Education campaign will be held during first month, and they desire the names of persons from Homewood Meeting who will assist in raising funds. There is a committee already appointed for this purpose:

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The subject of Pendle Hill Midwinter Institute was mentioned, and we approve of sending a delegate from Baltimore Monthly Meeting, and hope that some one may accept our invitation. The communication from Pendle Hill was referred to Miriam Brailey for further attention.

The Social Order Committee has our approval to proceed with their project of caring for displaced persons arriving in this country.

The Meeting then adjourned.
