The Finance Committee was asked to consider disposition of a sum of money in the Automobile Fund, but with the recommendation that the wishes of the contributors should be given consideration. It was suggested also that the money could be used toward the expenses of delegates to the World Conference to be held in Oxford, England in 1952.

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A communication was received from Leon Sachs, representing the Shelter Committee of the Baltimore Red Cross, requesting the use of our building and facilities in case of a disaster. The Clerk was directed to write Leon Sachs that the Peace Committee and the Committee on Ministry and Counsel have the matter under advisement and will bring forward their findings at next Monthly Meeting, at which time some decision will be reached.

To allow more time for Monthly Meeting business, it was decided to convene at 7:15 P.M. in second month.

The matter of appointing an auditor to examine the Monthly Meeting accounts for the year was referred to the Finance Committee.

Baltimore Interracial Fellowship requests the use of the Meeting House 2nd month 6th for a public meeting. The House and Grounds committee was authorized to advise that their request is granted, and that the usual charge will be made for opening the building.

We then adjourned to meet 2nd month 22nd, 1951 at 7:15 P.M.
