

AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING OF FRIENDS - HOMEWOOD
Held 11th month, 29th, 1951

Twenty-five members were present.

The Minutes of the Meeting held 10th month 25th, 1951 were read and approved.

A communication from James Walker, Executive Secretary of American Friends Fellowship Council and American Section-Friends World Committee states that their meeting this year will be held 1st month 25th, 26th and 27th, and as they were in Baltimore last year, they have decided to alternate and meet in Washington for their coming session. They much appreciated their visit to Homewood, and hope to again be with us at a later date.

An acknowledgment was received from Westbury Monthly Meeting dated 10th month 25th, 1951, accepting Elizabeth E. Haas as a member.

Michael Sweeney, Treasurer of the Baltimore War Resisters League writes us that he enjoyed his visit at last monthly Meeting, but expressed disappointment that financial help for their work had not been received, and that it would be needed before December 15. C. Wayne Carter was asked to mention this appeal in the News Letter, and that funds be sent to Edna Goodwin.

A card addressed to Homewood Monthly Meeting announces the arrival of Margaret Hill Parker, daughter of John Lindley Parker, 11th month, 15th, 1951.

Andrew Simon, on behalf of the joint Social Order Committee of Stony Run and Homewood, suggests that we sponsor one more displaced person. This was approved.

The American Red Cross again request the use of our building as a shelter in case of a disaster. The Clerk was directed to send them a copy of our communication of 5th month, 27th, which fully explains our stand.

Thomas W. Y. Clark mentioned that the Missions Committee desires to add the name of C. Wayne Carter to their Committee. This was approved.

We record the death of Elizabeth P. Hurst, which occurred 11th month 23rd, 1951.

The Temperance League of Maryland has asked us for funds, and the Social Order Committee reports that Five Dollars has been received for this work.

The Recorder was asked to note that the names of James Carey III and Edith Ely Horsey, had been dropped. Edith Ely Horsey has joined the Episcopal Church.

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It was felt that the Monthly Meeting supper could be served at 6:30 P.M. instead of 6 P.M., giving more people an opportunity to attend. The Meeting for business is not until 7:30, and the Ministry and Counsel Committee convenes at a different time.

Friends had signed a protest against the petition for a license to serve liquor in the Marylander Apartments, and we are glad to report that the Board of Liquor License Commissioners refused the permit.

Andrew Simon mentioned a series of meetings to be held on the second Thursday of each month, under the guidance of the Social Order Committee. We approve of this, and hope for a good attendance.
