

AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING OF FRIENDS - HOMEWOOD
Held 2nd month, 28th, 1952

There were 21 members present.

The Minutes of the Meeting held 1st month, 31st, were read, corrected and approved.

Verbal reports of Quarterly Meeting held 2nd month, 9th, 1952 at Baltimore, Md. were received from Andrew Simon, Edna Goodwin and Eleanor Richardson.

Baltimore Monthly Meeting's share of the \$75.00 to be raised by the Quarterly Meeting for its incidental expenses, is \$65.62. This was referred to the Finance Committee for attention.

The Quarterly Meeting asked that each Monthly Meeting recommend or nominate one person to the Quarterly Meeting Nominating Committee. This name should be reported to the Quarterly Meeting at Deer Creek 6th month 7th. We approve, and submit the matter to our Nominating Committee for their recommendation.

A report of the Committee on new and United Meetings in the Baltimore area (with particular reference to the West Baltimore Meeting) was read. We recommend to the Ministry and Counsel that it appoint a small committee to oversee the new West Baltimore Preparative Meeting and encourage visitation. We further recommend that this Committee be composed of those persons formerly on the Quarterly Meeting Committee on new and United Meetings. When it seems necessary that a Committee be requested to act with Stony Run to set up the West Baltimore Preparative Meeting as a Monthly Meeting, it shall also be made up of those persons formerly on the Quarterly Meeting Committee on new and United Meetings. That committee consisted of Thomas W. Y. Clark, James Hunter, Marlin Dawson, Eleanor Richardson and Wayne Carter, ex-officio. This was approved.

A request for transfer to Stony Run Meeting was received from Irene E. Mettee. The Clerk was directed to write her of our approval, and issue the necessary Certificate.

A letter from Irma Simon expressed appreciation for the bond money furnished Stephen Simon by Baltimore Monthly Meeting.

James Hunter was appointed Assistant Treasurer with power to make deposits to and withdraw funds from, over his own signature alone, the accounts of Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends, Homewood, now existing in the First National Bank and the Mercantile Trust Company, both of Baltimore City.

A letter from Mrs. F. Pole Robison, now living at the "Wrenwood Home" was read, expressing her appreciation and satisfaction with the surroundings there. Margaret K. Winslow, who received the letter, was asked to acknowledge it.

Our Social Order Committee was asked to sponsor two displaced persons, rather than one single man. We indorse this plan.

As the usual time of Monthly Meeting would fall within Yearly Meeting sessions, we agreed to adjourn to meet 3rd month 20th, at 7:30 P.M.
