

AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING OF FRIENDS - HOMEWOOD
Held 5th month, 29th, 1952

There were 22 members present.

The Minutes of the Meeting held 4th month, 24th were read, corrected and approved.

The committee appointed in 4th month to interview Ann T. Oliver and John Edward Stemmler regarding their proposed marriage, made verbal reports, and a communication was also read from Chester, Penna. United Monthly Meeting, stating they are in full accord with the views of the participants. Our clerk was asked to reply to Chester Monthly Meeting, stating we agree with the procedure, but that it be understood that the wedding, which is to take place at four o'clock 6th month 27th, is to be a public meeting for worship. Baltimore Monthly Meeting requested that a letter to the Parole Board be prepared by the executive secretaries of both Monthly and Yearly Meetings working through the Peace Committee, and signed by the Clerk of Baltimore Monthly Meeting.

A report was read of the minutes of West Baltimore United Preparative Meeting, held 4th month, 20th, 1952.

Margaret Hunter spoke on behalf of the Christian Education Committee of plans for the summer and fall First Day School.

A report of the Joint Social Order Committee and of the vocation of Friends Study Group of the Baltimore Meetings adopted 5th month 21st was handed to Friends attending Monthly Meeting, and it was approved that copies be sent to every member for full consideration during the summer. The Social Order Committee is to plan for a joint meeting in the fall, at which time the Oxford delegates will be asked to report. Action also will be taken at that time on the proposals of the Joint Social Order Committee.

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Kendall Long, speaking on behalf of the House and Grounds Committee, stated that the charge for the use of the Meeting House by the F.O.R. be \$35.00 and the W.I.L. \$50.00 for next season. This was approved.
