AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING OF FRIENDS - HOMEWOOD
Held 9th month, 25th, 1952

Twenty-six members were present.

The Meeting was opened with a period of devotion, after which the Minutes of the Meeting held 8th month 28th, 1952 were read, amended and approved.

An excellent written report was received from Howard Tschudy, one of our representatives to Quarterly Meeting, held 9th month 21st at Sandy Spring, Maryland.

George Loft of American Friends Service Committee, Philadelphia and our Clerk visited Col. Stanwood, State Director of Selective Service, and endeavored to have him recognize Homewood Monthly Meeting as a non-profit organization qualified to employ a conscientious objector. C. Wayne Carter, our Secretary, has been called for examination under Selective Service Act. At the meeting with Col. Stanwood he made it clear that Baltimore Monthly Meeting would have to definitely make a statement as to the amount of social service work done, before he would render a decision. After much discussion at this Monthly Meeting, we approved of asking Marlin Dawson, Thomas W. Y. Clark and the Clerk to write a letter setting forth our position in what we do and aim to do, and asking if Selective Service would approve us to employ a conscientious objector. We will withhold sending this letter until next Monthly Meeting, to see then whether or not it should be released.

The Fiftieth Anniversary of the establishment of the Five Years Meeting occurs in 1952. C. Wayne Carter, Katherine A. W. Simon and Miriam Brailley reviewed the material which had been sent us for publication and approved that posters should be placed on our Bulletin Board and that the matter be brought up at the Fellowship dinner in November, when some special remarks could possibly be given at that time. We decided to leave this in the hands of the above named committee.

G. Cheston Carey reminded us that a sum of money remains in the Margaret T. Carey memorial fund and it was approved that the amount be disposed of by placing it in a fund to aid visiting ministers pay their traveling expenses, etc. Thomas W. Y. Clark also stated that a considerable amount was unexpended in the Ober Fund, which is still in the hands of the Treasurer. We approved holding this until needed.

Matthew Lipa mentioned that Dr. Edward Grzegorzewski, Director of Health Organization, with office in Geneva, Switzerland, would be in Baltimore and could speak to our group. The Secretary was asked to set a date for a time convenient to the speaker.

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
