AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING OF FRIENDS - HOMEWOOD
Held 10th month, 30th, 1952

There were 28 members present.

The Minutes of the Meeting held 9th month 25th were approved as read.

As the time for holding next Monthly Meeting falls on Thanksgiving Day, we approved of setting the date of 11th month 20th. We invite Stony Run Meeting to worship with us at the morning service on Thanksgiving Day, 11th month, 27th.

Dr. Edward Grzegorzewski, Director of Health Organization with office in Geneva, Switzerland, will be in Baltimore and speak to our group at Homewood at 8 P.M. 11th month, 14th.

The Finance Committee report that the increase of \$410.00 as set by the Quarterly Meeting as our share, is not acceptable, in view of our financial situation, and we approved of referring the matter back to the Quarterly Meeting, reminding them of the loss of a substantial contributor.

A letter addressed to Col. Stanwood, State Director of Selective Service was read, in an endeavor to have him recognize Homewood Monthly Meeting as a non-profit organization qualified to employ a conscientious objector. We considered the matter very deeply, and agreed that the letter should be sent, with the hope that it will help express Friends views. Whether or not we will qualify and be recognized as an employer of a conscientious objector, remains with Col. Stanwood.

A Conference will be held at Homewood 11th month 8th to discuss certain phases of the Oxford, England Meeting of Friends, and the following persons were asked to serve as our representatives:
