Mirian Brailley reported on the visit of Dr. Horst Rothe, who came to Homewood describing his work with tubercular patients in Kenya Colony, Africa. He needs 20 concrete cottages to house 100 patients in rehabilitating those who have been treated. Each cottage will cost \$800.00. It was decided to request \$400.00 from the Miles White Fund for this purpose, and to try to raise \$400.00 from the Meeting by special solicitation, beginning with pledges at Fellowship Dinner. Whatever funds were raised were to be in cooperation with Stony Run if so desired by the respective Meetings.

The date of Tenth Month 28th. was approved for the visit of Mildred White. It was decided to ask her to speak at the Meeting for Understanding and Outreach, preceeding Monthly Meeting Supper.

Vera Shank gave an oral report of the minutes of the West Baltimore Preparative Meeting.

AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING OF FRIENDS  
(HOMWOOD)

Held Tenth Month 28th., 1954

There were 29 members present and 4 attenders.

In the absence of the Recording Clerk, Helen Silbernagel was appointed for the day.

The Minutes of the Meeting held Ninth Month 30th., 1954 were read and approved after amendment.

A report of the Nominating Committee with regard to naming a successor to Louis Mueller as Recording Clerk was postponed until the Next Monthly Meeting.

Doris Shamleffer discussed the exhibit prepared by the Joint Peace Committee on the USSR for the United Nations Exposition, held Tenth Month 24th. in the Fifth Regiment Armory. The exhibit provided a valuable experience both for those who prepared it and for those who viewed it. Materials were loaned by the Russian Orthodox Church and the Soviet Embassy. Expressions of appreciation from individuals and groups were quoted. The expenses of the exhibit were met by Peace Committee funds, supplemented by contributions from some Stony Run and Homewood Friends. Additional comments were made by Eleanor Richardson, Andrew Simon and Matthew Lipa.

A lengthy reply to the letter sent to nine of Maryland's Congressmen was received from Representative Fallon and will be posted on the bulletin board, together with its enclosures.

A proposal that replies be sent to the letters received from Congressmen, in answer to Friends communication on atomic energy, met with approval, and the Peace Committee was requested to draft a letter for the Clerk's signature.

A traveling minute granted to Harold Tollefson, Second Month 25th., 1954, was returned with endorsements from New England, Philadelphia, New York and Iowa Yearly Meetings. Accompanying it was a full report from Harold Tollefson on his visits to Yearly Meetings, to the World Council of Churches in Evanston, Illinois, Eighth Month, and to Friends and Meetings in many places.

A joint Meeting for Worship will be held with Stony Run Friends on Thanksgiving morning at Homewood Meeting House at 10.30 A.M.

Friends discussed the date of the Monthly Meeting to be held Eleventh Month, and decided that, since the date appointed falls on Thanksgiving day, the meeting will be held Eleventh Month 18th.. The date for Ministry and Council will be determined by that Committee.

A request was received from Joan Dudley, of Ithaca Monthly Meeting, and Austin Wattles, of Westtown Monthly Meeting to be married in Twelfth Month, under the care of this Meeting. It was informally stated that the proposed date is Twelfth Month 26th.

A letter of clearance on behalf of Joan Dudley from Ithaca Monthly Meeting was read by the Clerk. A letter on behalf of Austin Wattles has not yet been received.
