

At Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends - Homewood
Held 3rd mo. 24th, 1955 by adjournment from 2nd mo. 24th

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Baltimore Monthly Meeting desires that all future requests for funds be submitted to the Finance Committee, rather than asking the Trustees direct. This was approved.

A very interesting verbal report was made by Jeanne Newman regarding the special fund raised to send surplus food abroad.

A communication from Marshall Sutton states that Camp Keewadin may be sold, and another Camp site will have to be found. This letter was forwarded to the Monthly Meeting Secretary for further consideration.

Francis C. Anscombe, a former member and Minister here in 1917, writes us under date of 2nd mo. 23rd and offers to present to Baltimore Monthly Meeting a copy of his work entitled "The Contribution of the Quakers to the Reconstruction of the Southern States". This has not been published in book form, but we are offered a typewritten copy. The Clerk was requested to acknowledge the communication and to state that we accept with pleasure and thanks, his offer. We also request that when the historical work is received, that Jean Mason Smith review it.

In a letter from Gilbert Kilpack, mention is made of 12 scholarships which are available at Pendle Hill. A notice of this will be placed in the News Letter, in the hope that one or more Friends will avail themselves of the opportunity for further study.

Edna Goodwin expressed a concern that in First Day morning Meeting there should be more reading of the Bible and vocal prayers, and that persons be urged to speak louder, so that their messages may be heard.

Vera Shank gave a verbal report of the activities of West Baltimore Preparative Meeting.
