

AT BALTIMORE MONTHLY MEETING

OF FRIENDS (HOMWOOD)

Held: Sixth Month 30, 1955

Twenty-five members were present.

The minutes of the meeting held Fifth Month 26th., 1955 were read and approved.

One hundred per cent attendance of appointed representatives to Quarterly Meeting held at Darlington Sixth Month 4th. was reported. Several representatives reported very favorably of Walker Felton's lecture and demonstration of music used to enrich the life of the meeting.

A letter has been received from the First Baptist Church, Oak Ridge, Ill., dismissing Phyllis Underwood from its membership. It was decided that a letter of introduction, neither a sojourning minute nor a traveling minute, be prepared by the Clerk to go with Phyllis on her stay in Germany on a Fulbright teaching scholarship.

The Clerk reported sending a letter to Joseph Lewis, formerly of this meeting, to give to the minister of Trinity Methodist Church, Deland, Fla. who has written that Joseph Lewis' membership in that church would be acceptable.

The minutes of the called meeting held Fifth Month 26, 1955 were read and approved.

The committee that met with William Louckes and Elizabeth Hunter reported favorably and asked that the couple be released to be married Ninth Month 3, 1955. The following committee was appointed to meet with Edith and Marlin: Patricia Harrison, Helen Silbernagle, Marlin Dawson, Stephen Simon and Thomas M. Y. Clark.

Stephen Simon reported on the Peace Committee's concern that the World Council of Churches' peace appeal be indorsed by the Meeting and sent with a special letter to the President. This was approved.

Jeanne Newman reported that the Meeting has been notified by the Friends World Committee of the coming visits of foreign Friends early in October. Dates when they will be visiting at Stony Run and Homewood are being set up and Friends are encouraged to attend as many of these sessions as possible. If the time was too crowded it was decided to change Fellowship Dinner from Tenth Month 2 to Tenth Month 9, if necessary.

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
