Held: Tenth Month 27th., 1955

Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends (Homewood) met at 7:30 P.M., Fifth Day, Tenth Month 27, 1955. There were 19 members present. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as corrected. The minutes of the called meeting held First Day, Tenth Month 8, 1955 were read and approved.

The Clerk read a communication from the Meeting on Ministry and Counsel requesting that no finance letter concerning contributions be sent to attenders. After discussion, it was agreed that the Finance Committee send a special letter to attenders dealing with contributions, and that the committee appoint a suitable member to review the list of attenders so that certain attenders would not be sent a letter. Miriam Brailey was appointed to write the letter.

Ministry and Counsel also requested that the Meeting direct the Nominating Committee to report to the Monthly Meeting held in Eleventh Month the names of several younger members for membership on the Meeting for Ministry and Counsel. This was approved.

The Clerk read a letter from Elizabeth Stewart, addressed to the Nominating Committee, and referred to the Monthly Meeting, asking to be released from the Committees on Christian Education and Hospitality. This was approved.

The Clerk read a certificate of removal requested on behalf of Jane Stewart Ewing from Germantown Monthly Meeting, Germantown, Pa., and recommending her to the care of Homewood Friends. The transfer was accepted with pleasure.

A similar certificate was read from New Garden Monthly Meeting, Guilford College, N.C., recommending Byron Branson to the care of Homewood Friends. This transfer was accepted with pleasure.

A letter was read from W. Herbert Brown, Secretary of the Co-operative Committee of the two Yearly Meetings, presenting further views on changing the season and place of Yearly Meetings.

A letter was read from the American Friends Service Committee regarding seminars for young Friends of high school age and encouraging a larger attendance at future seminars. The letter and enclosures was referred to the Christian Education Committee.

Announcement was made of an all-day conference on the Bible to be held Seventh Day, Eleventh Month 19 at Hunting Ridge Presbyterian Church at 9:45 A.M.

Announcement was also made that the American Friends Service Committee's Annual Institute on International Relations will be held at Homewood Meeting House Eleventh Month 11 and 12. William Edgerton, J. Norman Whitney and William Frye will be the faculty. The subject will be "Speak Truth to Power."

It was announced that Henry Cadbury will lead seminars on the Gospel of John Eleventh Month 18 and 19 at Pendle Hill.
